The Divide

- 82% are Online (access the internet regularly or occasionally)
- 18% are Offline (never used/rarely used the internet)
- Men (88%) were more likely to be Internet users than women (84%).
- Internet users by region: highest is London (90%); lowest is Northern Ireland (79%).

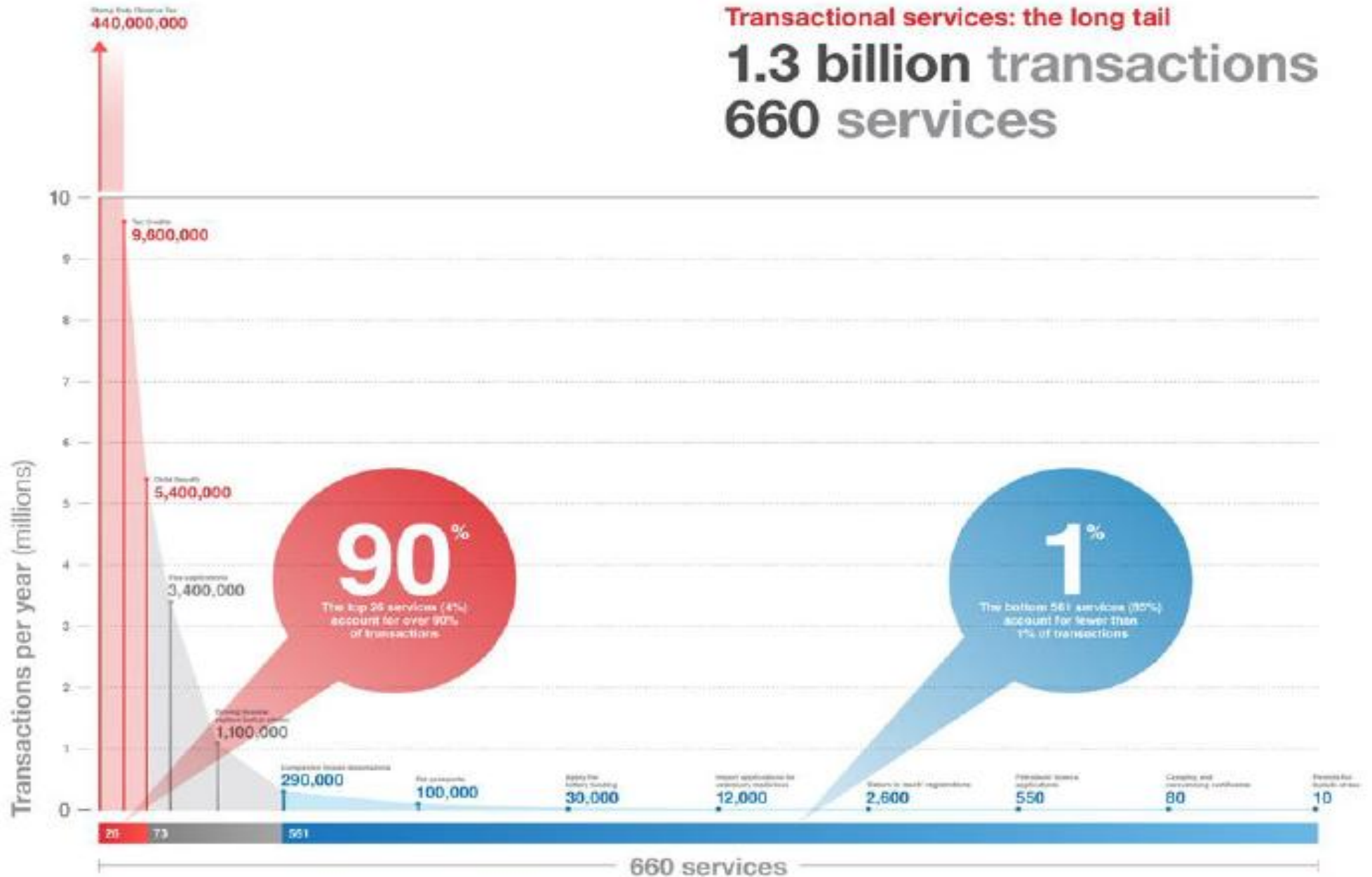
Which of the following services do you regularly use online?

“This strategy sets out how the government will become digital by default. By digital by default, we mean digital services that are so straightforward and convenient that all those who can use them will choose to do so whilst those who can't are not excluded”.

Assisted Digital

“To ensure that people who are offline can access digital by default services, we will offer them ways to access services offline, and we will provide additional ways for them to use the digital services. These services must be designed to meet user needs”

Health

People over the age of 65 account for more than half of all NHS spending; however 40% of those aged 65 and over do not have access to the internet at home and 5 million of these have never been online.

Disability

People with a disability are three times more likely to have never used the internet. 4 million people with a disability have never been online.

UK Online Centres

Network of 3,800 community based UK online centres across England. They provide skills training on their www.learnmyway.com website, run marketing campaigns, nurture “digital champions”, offer training and project opportunities, administer grant funding to help centres help more people make the most of online life.

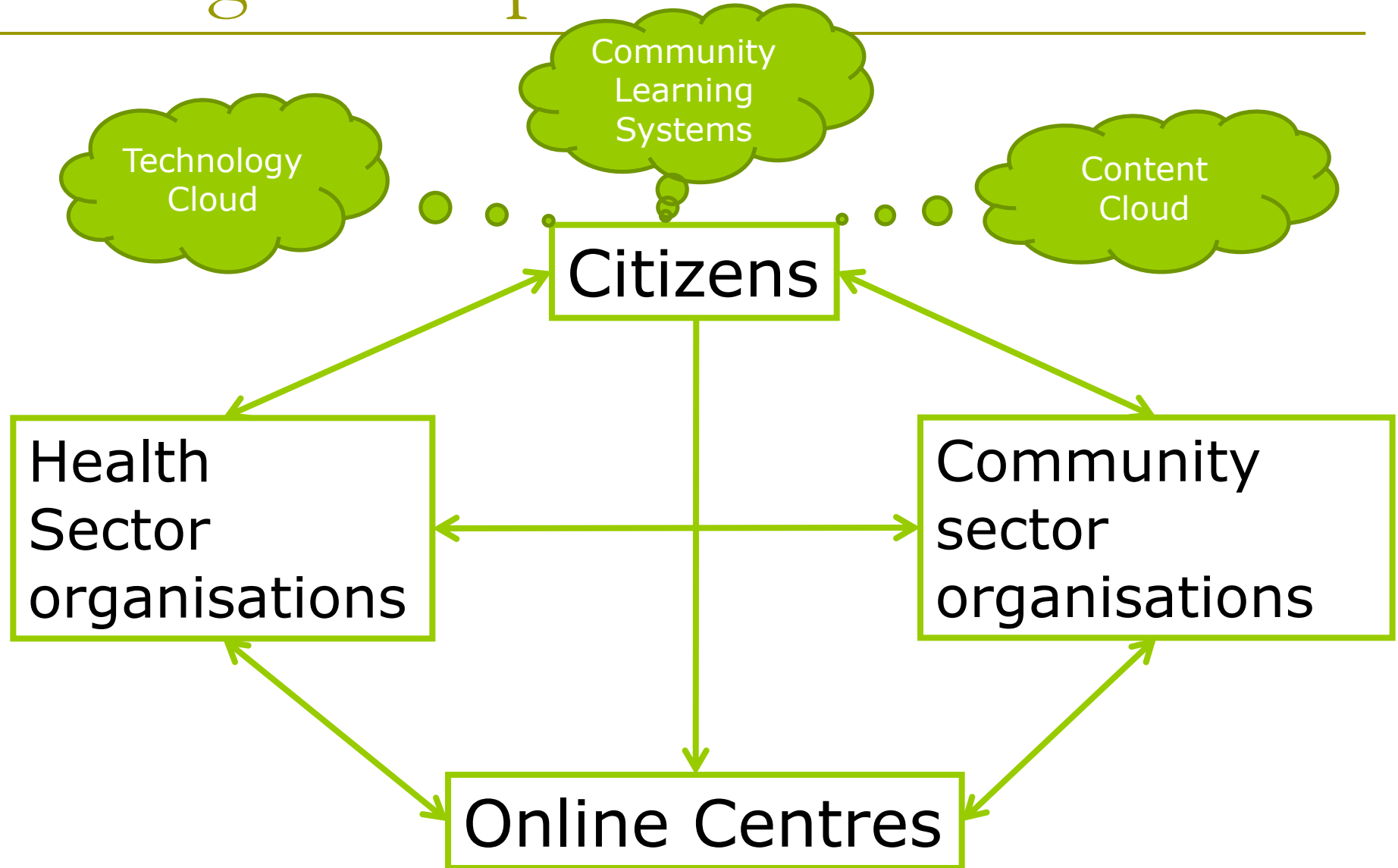
